Over 400 young people, teachers, and parents, were asked what they wanted from this year's Anti-Bullying Week. Again and again, the young and not-so-young said that they wanted anti-bullying work to be about hope and the positive and kind things we can do to halt hurtful behaviour in its tracks.

Call To Action:

-Ask if someone's OK. Say you're sorry. Just say hey.
