HEADTEACHER UPDATE

Dear Parent and Carers,

As we come towards the end of the Spring Term I would like to share some wonderful highlights with you and reflect on what has been another, outstanding term.

Children have experienced a wealth or enrichment activities: Railway Museum, Leeds City Museum, Leeds City Art Gallery, Zoom calls with NASA Astronauts, Zoom calls with famous authors and illustrators, life-saving Mini-Medics, chicks, Wonderdome, dance competitions, Easter bonnet parades and much more! These valuable experiences lift our curriculum off the paper and give your children the most memorable life experiences. You can follow all our activities on our social media accounts.

In addition to the above, we have again been successful with gaining awards: all schools receiving national attendance awards -Beckwithshaw and Ripley in the top 25% and Kettlesing in the top 10%! Kettlesing and Beckwithshaw have also been shortlisted for the Service Children's Friendly School Award 2024 (we find out on 22.03) and the Kettlesingers sang beautifully in the Harrogate Competitive Music Festival 2024. As you can see, even though a short term, we have done so much!

Thank you so much to all those who filled in our Spring Term Questionnaire, as you will see from the above, trips, visits, clubs, staffing, and experiences post pandemic were key points raised from Autumn along with help for homework to support yourselves and increased communication channels. The questionnaires are a super way for us to support you and to action your ideas and thoughts. Thank you so much for all the wonderful responses to this term's. Highlights being that your children are telling you all about their learning when they get home; communication continues to be much improved; staffing is settled and children learning well; your children have access to more clubs and trips and the competitions they now take part in build that team spirit . 100% feel their child is kept safe at school; that your child does well in school and that 'staff are working well together and are happy and fulfilled in their job. They all know the children even if they are not in their class.' All these comments really do shine through.

Of course, there are always things for us to reflect on and this is why we hugely value not only termly questionnaires but the conversations we have with you. The feedback regarding teacher/TA support if staff are redeployed for behaviour support; increased usage of school fields, even more whole federation events; FORS, FOBS and FOKS targeted fundraising; cooking and baking (life skills) and even more clubs on offer will all be discussion points as we transition after Easter from an IEB to a Full Governing body: another hugely exciting and positive move forward for our federation.

I continue to be proud of all stakeholders and to lead this wonderfully successful federation of schools - I know you are too as 100% of those who completed the questionnaire felt proud that their child attends our federation. How delightful!

Thank you to all who donated. We raised £33 for this amazing cause, and the children learnt all about how their money will help.










THE WONDERDOME

WHAT WE'VE BEEN DOING

Class 1

Class One have been super busy this month.

They have been watching for the signs of Spring outside and looking at the bulbs beginning to sprout into flowers. Due to this interest we have been observing daffodils up close in our creative area. We looked carefully at their shape and have drawn and painted our own versions of Daffodils. We then used our phonics knowledge alongside a word bank to label our pictures.

We have also been learning some rhyming poems. We have been identifying rhyming words and had a go at

creating our own rhyming poems. In Maths Reception have been looking at height - and using the words, tall, taller, short and shorter. We created different towers out of different objects and we used the correct language to describe them.



Class 2 Class 2 have thoroughly enjoyed the



Class 2 have thoroughly enjoyed their topics this half term. They have discovered what makes a shadow, learned new vocabulary such as opaque, translucent and transparent and can explain why each of these types of shadow would occur. They have loved their topic of ballads, especially listening to Space Oddity by David Bowie! They created their own actions to match the lyrics from the story and are now starting to write their own ballad! They have researched all about the Amazon Rainforest in Geography and have linked this to their English by writing a non-chronological report on it. In French, they have been learning days of the week, months of the year and numbers to 31 so that they can say their birthday. They have really enjoyed their Forest School sessions, where they have built dens, used hammers and saws to make their own creations and made lots of different food using the fire circle. They also continue to work very hard on their Maths work which has been length and perimeter. Well done Class 2!

Class 3

Mini Medics, Science Week and World Book Day have meant that Class 3 have been developing their

skills and furthering their learning in many different areas of the curriculum this month. We have been learning more about the Rainforest, studying the different tribes that inhabit the Amazon, as well as the animals and plants that live in the different layers. We have been learning all about what unique animals wolves are, to enable us to write our non-chronological reports this week. Science week this week was made particularly special today, as Class 3 and Class joined together to share and extend their science and geography knowledge by creating shadow puppets for a Rainforest Shadow Theatre. Not only did both classes demonstrate excellent teamwork skills, but they produced a magical puppet show together.
